## **MEEKER COUNTY AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY INDIVIDUAL COMPETITION AGREEMENT**

For all persons and entities exhibiting animals, arts, crafts, food and plants in competition (collectively referred to as 'Exhibitor') at the Meeker County Fairgrounds (hereinafter referred to as 'Fairgrounds').

Exhibitor shall be allowed to use the space as assigned.

Exhibitor agrees to, and shall comply with, the following terms:

1. Exhibitor shall comply with all Rules of the Meeker County Agricultural Society (hereinafter referred to as "Society"), a copy of which is attached hereto. Exhibitor shall also comply with all directives of the officers or employees of the Society.
2. **Waiver of Liability.** Exhibitor shall release the Society, its Directors, officers, employees, agents and assigns, from any and all claims, actions, causes of action, and demands by reason of any damage, theft, or loss, injury or suffering sustained by the Exhibitor or any other persons, in consequence of or in relation to the Exhibitor's participation in the Meeker County Fair, or use of the Fairgrounds. It is agreed that participation in the Meeker County Fair, or use of the space in the Fairgrounds, is voluntary and at the sole risk of the Exhibitor.
3. **Indemnification and Hold Harmless.** Any and all claims that arise or may arise against Exhibitor, its agents, servants, employees or assigns, as a consequence of any act or omission on the part of the Exhibitor or its agents, servants, employees, or assigns while engaged in the performance of this contract or its activities shall in no way be the obligation of or responsibility of the Society. Exhibitor shall indemnify, hold harmless and defend the Society, its officers and employees, against any and all liability, loss, costs, damages, expenses, claims or actions, including attorney's fees which the Society, its officers or employees may hereafter sustain, incur or be required to pay, arising out of or by reason of any act or omission of Exhibitor, its agents, servants or employees, in the execution, performance, or failure to adequately perform Exhibitor's obligations or activities.
4. **Insurance.** Exhibitor shall, at all times during the terms of this contract, keep in force the following insurance protection in the limits specified:
  - a. Automobile coverage for all vehicles and trailers in the minimum amount required by the Minnesota No-Fault Insurance Act.
  - b. Property insurance in an amount sufficient to protect Exhibitor from loss. Exhibitor shall rely entirely upon its own property insurance for recovery with respect to any damage, loss or injury to its property.
  - c. Liability insurance in the minimum amount of \$1,000,000.
5. **Operation.** Exhibitor shall properly staff its exhibit at all times it is open to the general public.

- Wash your hands with soap and water before and after entering the barns
- Refrain from eating & drinking while visiting the animals
- Avoid carrying anything in the barns that comes in contact with your mouth (pacifiers, sippy cups, etc.)
- Watch your step! Check your shoes and stroller wheels for any signs of animal manure before you go home
- **DO NOT FEED** the animals. Their owners will take of properly feeding them

We encourage fair guests to observe the animals, but you should always ask before petting any animals. If you have questions about animals, always feel free to ask an exhibitor in that area.

# LIVESTOCK ARRIVAL & REQUIREMENTS

## REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL ANIMALS

*4-H, FFA and Open Class*

- **ARRIVAL TIME:** 4-H, Open Class & FFA animals may begin arriving at 7:00 AM on Wednesday, Aug. 2
  - **4-H** animals must be in place by specified times (*varies by species*) – **see page 27 for times**
  - **FFA Children's Barnyard** animals must arrive Wednesday, Aug. 2 from 2:00-5:00 PM
  - **Open Class and FFA** animals must be in place by 7:00 AM on Thursday, August 3 (*excluding Open Class Rabbits*)
    - \***Open Class & FFA Swine** must be in place by **7:30 PM on Wednesday** - **\*NEW**
- **IDENTIFICATION CHECK:** Will entail superintendent and other staff checking for proper ear tag/tattoo/etc. **\*Refer to pages 29-31** for proper identification guidelines for your species
  - **ANY ANIMAL WITHOUT PROPER ID WILL BE SENT HOME** (*not eligible for show or premium*)
  - All animals must have ear tag/tattoo, etc. prior to arriving at fairgrounds  
No tagging/tattooing allowed once at fair
  - Exhibitor is encouraged to be present during ID check, but may be reachable by phone if not present
- **HEALTH CHECK:** All animals will be examined by an official veterinarian. Any animal showing signs of illness or infectious disease will be required to leave the fairgrounds (*not eligible for show or premium*)

*These animal identification and health requirements are set by the **Minnesota Board of Animal Health***





# LIVESTOCK HEALTH & ID INFORMATION

## GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

**CHECK-IN:** All animals will be officially checked in by the species superintendent. Written information will be taken on each animal's **official ID and/or health requirements.**

**Animals without proper identification or presenting health conditions will not be allowed to remain at the fair.** Exhibitors should have information ready for their superintendents upon arrival.

**CHECK-IN INFO:** Exhibitor name, Exhibitor phone number, Official identification information for *EACH* animal.

**HEALTH:** NO animal may enter, or be at a public exhibition, that is showing clinical signs of any infections, contagious or communicable disease. An official veterinarian will examine all animals at the fair.

**IDENTIFICATION:** Animals must have proper identification outlined by the Minnesota Board of Animal Health. Exhibitors are responsible for **officially identifying** their animals **before bringing them to the fair.** Additionally, anyone placing official ID in livestock must keep records. These rules provide better protection of animals and people at the fair by enabling the Board to more quickly locate potentially affected animals during a disease event. **See the following pages for proper identification.**

*\*Exhibitors may obtain free official ID by calling the Board or ordering online. Listing of acceptable official ID is available at [www.bah.state.mn.us](http://www.bah.state.mn.us)*

**OUT-STATE:** All out-of-state animals must meet Minnesota importation requirements for their species.

**ARRIVAL:** All livestock may begin arriving on Wed., Aug. 2. All Open Class and FFA livestock must be in place by 7:00 AM on Thurs., Aug. 3.

**\*Open Class & FFA Swine** by 7:30 PM on Wed.

**\*4-H and FFA Children's Barnyard livestock have different arrival deadlines (see page 27).**

**DEPART:** All livestock (except dairy and sheep) may begin leaving the fair on **Sunday at 6:00 PM.** Dairy and sheep may depart starting at **6:30 PM.**

## HERDSMANSHIP

**DISPLAY:** The Meeker County Fair Board urges all 4-H, FFA, and Open Class exhibitors to have stalls and pens neat and clean for fair guests. A few decorations in your exhibit will also make the barn more attractive and fun for visitors to see.

**\*No Herdsmanship contest will be held this year**

## PARKING INFORMATION

**TRAILERS:** Can be parked in the field across from the West Gate during the fair. Trailers must enter through the North Gate, and exit through either the South or Northwest Gates (see map).

**VEHICLES:** You may purchase a parking permit for \$30, which allows you to park inside the fairgrounds during the fair. **\*Limited number available. Sold in the Fair Office beginning at noon on Wednesday, Aug. 2. First come, first served.**

**CAMPERS:** Camper passes are available for \$100 (no power). You must park in designated camper area (see map). **\*Email [ludwigranch@gmail.com](mailto:ludwigranch@gmail.com) before July 29 for reservations.** **\*Limited number available. First come, first served.**

## SHOWING RULES

**PREREGISTER:** All OPEN CLASS and FFA animals must **PREREGISTER** in order to be eligible for premiums. **Late registrations will NOT be accepted!**

**4-H PREMIUMS:** In order to earn a premium, 4-H animals must be either 1. Housed at the Fair, or 2. 4-Her must submit an informational sign/poster about their animal to be displayed. Dogs, and Pet Show animals will be exempt from rule, as housing is not available for these species.

**MULTIPLE SHOWS:** The same animal may be shown in 4-H and Open Class, or FFA and Open Class, but it cannot be shown in both 4-H and FFA.

## SPECIFIC SPECIES RULES

**CATS:** Must be accompanied by a certificate of rabies vaccination issued by a licensed veterinarian. They must also have trimmed nails (front and rear).

**CATTLE:** Must be officially identified **prior to exhibition** with one of the following:

- National Uniform Ear Tagging System (NUES)
  - Plastic or metal tags beginning with the official state # - "41" for MN

2. Animal Identification Number (AIN) System

- 15-digit tag beginning with “840” for the U.S.
- Visual or Radio Frequency Identification (RFID)



3. AIN (Animal identification number) Tags

- Include 15 digits, beginning with “840” prefix
- Includes 4-H tags that have 15 digits, beginning with “840” prefix



3. Breed Registry Tattoos and Tags

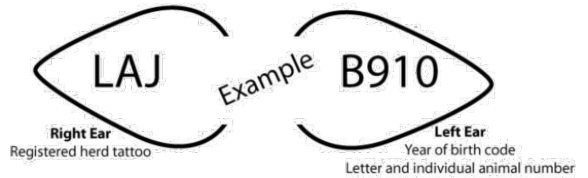
- Acceptable for within-state movement if accompanied by documentation listing the breed registration number
- Pending registrations are not acceptable.

4. Official Tattoos

For any tattoo to be considered official, it must be legible **REGISTERED SHEEP/GOATS:**

- Breed registry tattoos that are recorded with a sheep or goat registry association
- Animal must be accompanied by a copy of the registration certificate or a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection listing tattoo and registration number

**DOGS:** Dogs 4 months of age or older must have a certificate of rabies vaccination issued by a licensed veterinarian.



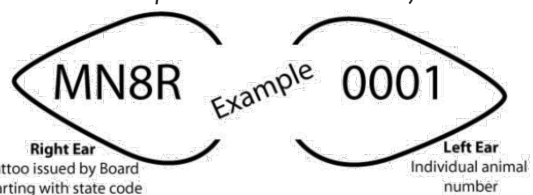
**GOATS & SHEEP:** No sheep or goat that is within 30 days of giving birth (either before or after) may be exhibited without prior approval from the Board. Must be officially identified prior to exhibition with one of the following (official ear tags must display the US shield):

**NON-REGISTERED SHEEP/GOATS**

- State-approved tattoos that are recorded with state animal health officials
- Tattoo must include the state-approved prefix beginning with the state abbreviation and include a unique animal number
- Animal must be accompanied by either:
  - 1) A Board-issued document certifying the tattoo prefix is recorded with the Board
  - 2) For animals originating outside of MN, a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection which:
    - A) Certifies the tattoo prefix is assigned in the National Scrapie Database, and
    - B) Lists the flock ID number and the complete tattoo number (including state prefix and animal number)

1. Flock Identification (ID) Tags

- Metal or plastic tag with the flock ID number beginning with state abbreviation along with a unique herd management number.
- Used for goats/sheep born on the premises associated with the flock/herd ID



2. Sheep/Goat Serial Tags

- Begins with state abbreviation; eight characters total, last 4 or 5 numerical
- May be plastic or metal



**HORSES:** Horses, except suckling foals accompanying a negative dam, must be negative to an official equine infectious anemia (EIA) test conducted within 12 months prior to the opening date of exhibition.

A description of the horse including age, breed, color, sex and distinctive markings when present (brands, tattoos, scars or blemishes).

## POULTRY (chickens, turkeys, & gamebirds):

Waterfowl and pigeons do not have any exhibition requirements

All chickens, turkeys and game birds, except baby poultry, must be individually identified with a leg or wing band.



Official ID must not be removed once applied.

Young poultry that are too small to band, can be exhibited as a group if the Hatchery Permit number or NPIP number is written on the cage.

### Poultry Testing Requirements

1. All Chickens, turkeys, game birds, and hatching eggs from these birds must originate from a hatchery or breeding flock that is classified U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid Clean under NPIP or be negative to a pullorum-typhoid test within 90 days prior to the opening of the exhibition.
2. All poultry must be accompanied by a certificate or test chart that shows compliance with these requirements. Examples can be found on the MN Board of Animal Health website:  
<http://www.bah.state.mn.us/official-id/#poultry>
3. If a test chart is used to demonstrate compliance, the band number on the bird must match what is listed on the test chart.

**RABBITS:** All rabbits must be individually identified with a permanent ear tattoo.

*\*Each rabbit must have a different tattoo number.*



**SWINE:** Breeding and feeding swine must be officially identified prior to exhibition with one of the following:

1. National Uniform Ear Tagging System (NUES)  
Plastic or metal tags beginning with the official state number – “41” for MN



2. Animal Identification Number (AIN) System
  - 15-digit tag beginning with “840”, the U.S code
  - Visual or Radio Frequency Identification (RFID)



3. Ear Notching, with Breed Registration
  - Acceptable if accompanied by documentation listing the breed registration number – pending registrations are not acceptable
4. Slap or Ear Tattoos
  - Acceptable for feeding swine only
  - A tattoo (or tag) with a monitored herd number or state/national assigned premises number is acceptable

- All exhibits must be **labeled** with the name of the variety. Each exhibitor is request to bring their own **display plates**.
- Only one entry per lot, per exhibitor. All exhibits must be **2023 crop**, unless otherwise stated.
- All vegetables should have **stems**, except tomatoes.
- SNAP BEANS:** Harvest before constrictions appear between seeds, when seeds are about half grown. Ends of pods should not be broken off in picking. Pods should be uniform. Leave on stems. Pods may be wiped clean, but not washed.
- BEETS, CARROTS, PARSNIPS, RADISHES, RUTABAGAS:** Root crops should be mature but not overgrown, pithy or course in texture. Tops trimmed off 1/2-1 inch above crown. Side roots trimmed off but not tap root.
- BROCCOLI:** Heads should be dark or purplish green and compact. Avoid yellow flowers in head. Stems cut about 5 inches from top of head.
- CABBAGE:** Stems cut about 1/4 inch below the head. Remove blemished or broken leaves but care should be taken not to peel the heads too much. A few outside wrapped leaves are desirable. Specimens may be washed.
- CAULIFLOWER:** Heads should be white, compact, and free of small leaves and rice-like texture. Stems cut so as to leave 4-6 leaves. Outer leaves trimmed to 1-2 inches above the white head. Use soft bristled brush to remove dirt from head.
- CELERY:** Remove roots and trim to form a triangle or pyramid. Trim diseased and broken leaves on outside until color is uniform.
- SWEET CORN:** Select ears that are well filled out to the tip. Kernels should be milky and juicy. Remove outer husks but leave 2 flag leaves, trim shank to 1/4 inch and trim silk 1 inch from tip.
- CUCUMBERS-PICKLING:** Select fruits 3-5 inches long. Specimen should be of same maturity and uniform in size, shape and color.
- KOHLRABI:** Roots removed just below the ball. Trim leaves to 2". Select specimens that are uniform, medium size, and not hard or woody. Skin should be easily punctured by thumbnail. They should be clean but not washed.
- ONIONS:** Have specimens mature and thoroughly cured. The neck should be small. Do not peel to give slick appearance. Only such outer scales that are broken or discolored should be removed. Small basal roots should be left intact but trimmed to a uniform length of 1/2 inch. Wipe or brush but do not wash. Tops trimmed.
- POTATOES:** Tubers should be uniform in size, color and shape. Washing is permitted but do not blemish the skins by scrubbing. Avoid specimens with defects or disease.

- RHUBARB:** Select specimens that are straight, uniform and unblemished. Stalks should be pulled from the plant, not cut. Trim the leaf blade to about 1 inch above stalk.
- SUMMER SQUASH:** Select small to medium size fruits when the rind is soft and easily punctured with thumbnail. Leave about 1/2 inch of stem and wipe fruits clean.
- WINTER SQUASH, SPAGHETTI SQUASH, PUMPKINS:** Select mature specimens where the rind resists pressure of the thumbnail. Fruits should be free of defects. Leave stem attached to fruit.
- SWISS CHARD:** Select plants that are fresh, crisp and have bright green leaves. Trim off roots and trim butts to 1/2 inch shape. Trim off diseases and broken leaves on the outside until the color is uniform.
- TOMATOES:** Select fruit that are uniform in size, shape & color. Fruits should be perfectly shaped without cracks or blemishes. Remove stem.

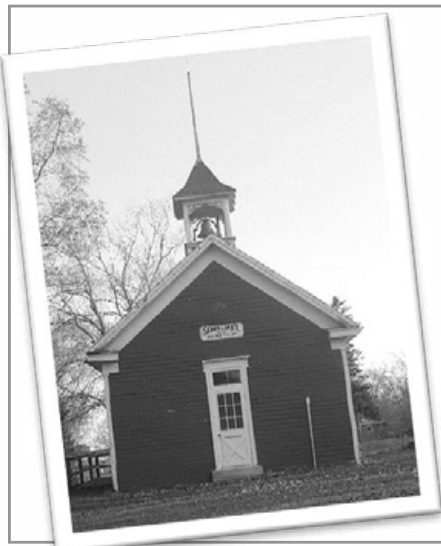

1. **Meeker County Extension Master Gardeners** will have a booth in the Fine Arts Building.
2. Entries are open to all who wish to exhibit, but are limited to individuals.
3. Limited workspace will be provided. Allow yourself plenty of time to set up your exhibits. Please do not use the exhibit tables. Bottles will be furnished for specimens. Exhibitors can pick up bottles early in the week from the Fine Arts Building if you want to set up your specimens at home. Please stand dried specimens in bottles.

## OPEN CLASS RULES

1. The **exhibitor must grow** all horticulture specimens. Potted and hanging plants must be in the exhibitor's possession for at least two months.
2. Read your schedule well; take care to enter exhibits in the proper class. A specimen will be **disqualified if it has more or less stems, sprays, stalks, blooms, etc.** than the number specified. A bud showing color is classified as a flower.
3. Houseplants, patio potted plants and hanging plants should be **labeled** with the variety of flower names. Please put variety or flower name on tags of the specimens.
4. Specimens should be clean, free of insect damage and with an attractive amount of foliage left attached. Remove all foliage below waterline.
5. **ROSES** should be shown with at least 3, 5, or 7 leaflet leaves above waterline.
6. **DAHLIAS** should have all but the 2 top pairs of leaf brackets removed. Stem length should be 24-30". Re-cut stems under water.

7. Prop specimen securely straight in the bottle. Small wedges are available for this.
8. Flowers and foliage for arrangements keep best if hardened in deep water overnight. It is best to pick your flowers the day before, keep them in a cool area and in deep water.
9. **Cut all specimen stems** long enough to present a good appearance in the bottle. Points are usually taken off for specimens with too short of stems.
10. Only **authorized personnel** will be permitted within the area during judging. First, second and third place prizes will be awarded in each class, if merited. Youth classes will award five places. Blue, red and white stickers will be placed on the tags when judging. Ribbons will be with the premium checks. The decision of the judges is final. Classes may be subdivided at the discretion of the show superintendent.
11. All exhibits must be left in place until **6:00 PM on Sunday**. Please remove your exhibits promptly at that time. The Fair Board will not be responsible for any private property or exhibits. The superintendent and committee will remove any unsightly flowers or arrangements during the show.

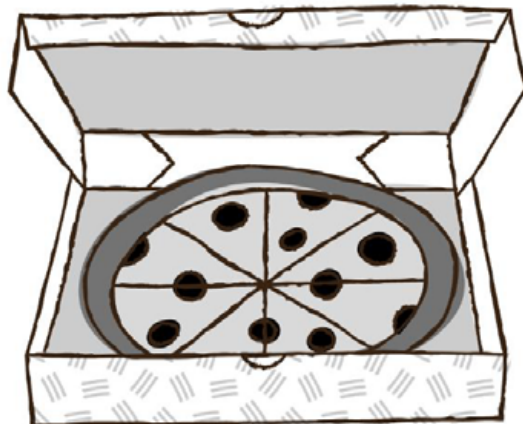

General Judging Guidelines:

#### REFERENCES:

- Ball Blue Book® of Preserving, copyright 2020
- USDA Complete Guide to Home Canning, 2015 revised
- Ball Complete Book of Home Preserving, copyright 2020

#### ELIGIBILITY:

- Entries must be labeled with product name, date of preparation, processing method and processing time.
- All preserved foods must have been prepared within one year period from judging date.

### QUALITY CRITERIA

#### FILLED JARS:

- Headspace must correspond to instructions on the jar and lid packaging or the reference guide listed. The top of the finished recipe or liquid covering product should provide adequate headspace as stated in approved guidelines.
- Air bubbles must be kept to a minimum. Gas bubbles denote spoilage and are identified by movement to the surface of the product while the jar is stationary.
- Bands should remain in place to transport preserved food. Remove bands carefully to determine if the headspace is correct. Replace bands for display.

#### HEAT PROCESS:

- Methods used to heat process foods must comply with current preserving guidelines as stated in the approved reference guides. The boiling-water process for acid foods and steam-pressure process for low-acid foods are the only recommended methods to heat process foods for preserving.
- Times for heat processing preserved foods correctly vary depending on specific recipe or food type. Processing time must be in agreement with those listed in approved reference guide.

#### PRODUCT APPEARANCE:

- Products should be free from blemishes, stems, pits and peels. Some recipes may state stems, pits and peels are not removed – this is acceptable if the recipe is in keeping with all other preserving guidelines.

- Liquid must be clear and free from cloudiness and small particles unless there are ingredients added to the recipe that would naturally affect the clarity.
- Color of the finished product should be as close to its natural characteristics as possible or standard for cooked product.
- Texture is affected by heat processing, yet the finished products should not appear over-cooked or broken down.
- Ingredients should retain their shape and size based on the type and preparation method. Cut pieces, of uniform size, should be packed evenly in the jar, yet allow adequate room for liquid to circulate throughout the jar.
- Safety is of utmost importance. Any entry exhibiting spoilage or not in compliance with judging guidelines must be disqualified.

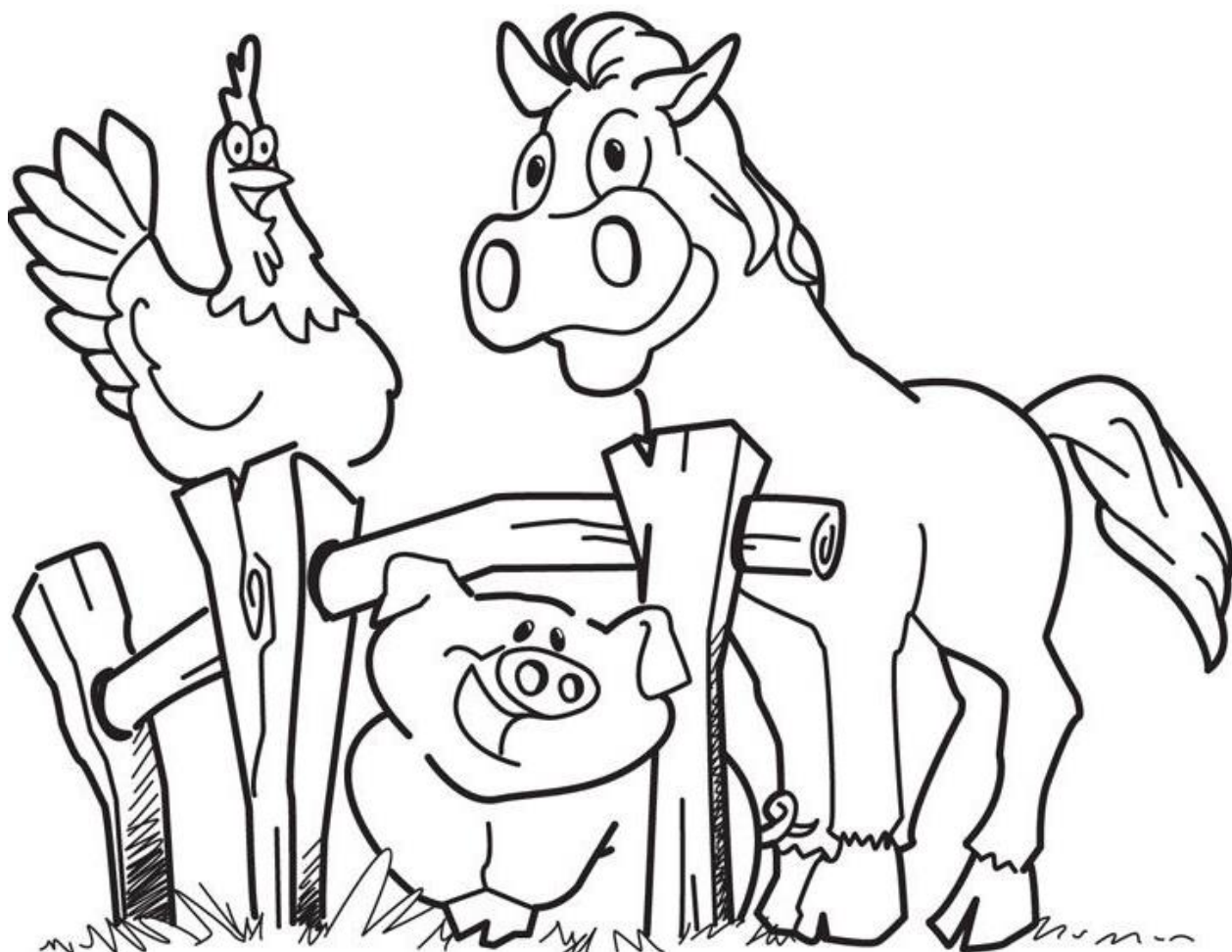

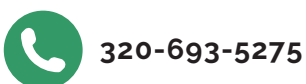

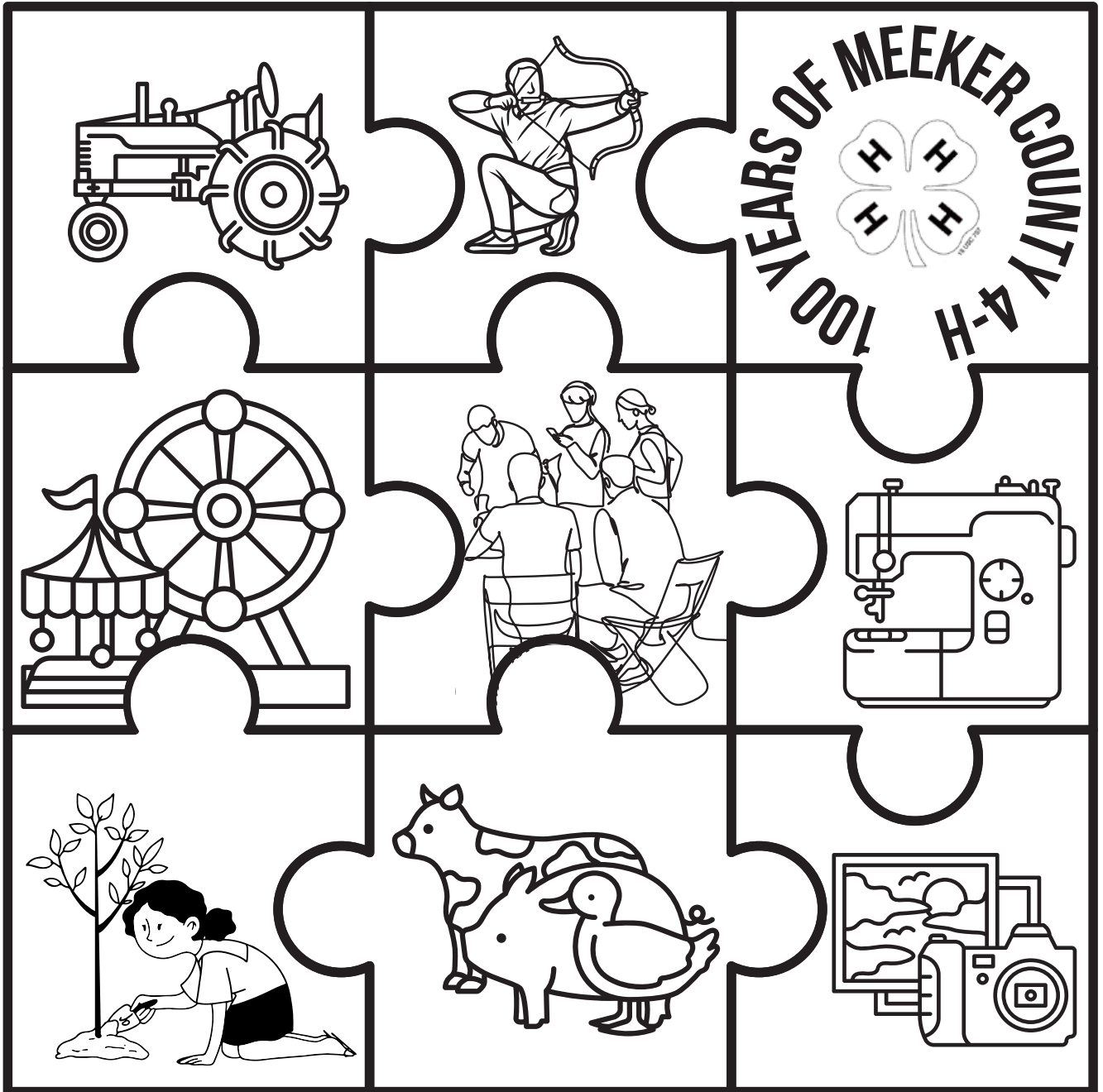
