## OPEN CLASS RULES

- No more than one entry per lot.
- Each exhibitor is requested to bring their own **display plates**.
- Plates of **apples** must consist of exactly 4 specimens. Crab or hybrid, 8 specimens. **EACH VARIETY CORRECTLY LABELED WITH NAME.**
- Exhibitors may **replace** with fresh fruit, any specimen that shows a tendency to spot or decay at any time during the fair, except when the judges are working on the class to which it belongs.
- Decayed, injured or inferior specimens must not be exhibited, and when such specimens appear in a collection, the entire exhibit may be disqualified.
- When the number of competitors in any lot is less than the number of awards offered, the judges may, at their discretion, award the lower prizes, omitting the higher ones; but premiums will not be awarded on inferior collections or specimens, even if there is no competition.
- Overgrown specimens are not desirable. Select specimens normal and uniform in size, color and quality. **Name of fruit to be displayed on exhibit.**
- The superintendent will provide uniform label cards and see that they are properly attached to all fruit and vegetable entries. Name variety, if possible.
